### Flyover Construction to Slow Down Traffic in the Loop

#### The closures: Aug. 19-31

• The inbound Kennedy ramp to inbound Congress Parkway will be closed. Drivers will be detoured to the Roosevelt Road exit, Jefferson Street, Harrison Street and Wells Street to connect with Congress Parkway.

#### Aug. 21-23 and Aug. 28-30

• Inbound Congress Parkway will close at 10 p.m. Fridays. Drivers will be detoured to the outbound Dan Ryan's Roosevelt Road exit, Jefferson Street, Harrison Street and Wells Street to connect with Congress Parkway.

• Outbound Eisenhower will close by 5 a.m. Saturdays. Drivers will be detoured to Wells Street, Harrison Street, Jefferson Street, Van Buren Street and Ashland Avenue to connect with the Eisenhower. Lower Wacker Drive will follow the same detour.

• Both directions of the Kennedy and Dan Ryan between Ohio Street and 18th Street will be reduced to one lane at 8 p.m. Saturdays, with all the lanes closed for 15-minute intervals 10 p.m. Saturdays to 7 a.m. Sundays. All of the lanes will be reopened by 10 a.m. Sundays. Drivers can take a detour to the outbound Eisenhower's Ashland Avenue exit and entrance ramps to access the Kennedy and Dan Ryan from the inbound Eisenhower.

• All of the lanes on Congress Parkway will reopen and traffic will return to normal by 5 a.m. Mondays.

Lately I have been trying to remind myself that whenever I have something touchy, sensitive, or otherwise difficult to say to — or about — somebody, it's probably a good idea to do it in person. Ideally, in the same place at the same time, not on the phone, or via Skype. It's something I like to call Actual Reality (AR®).

A news story here in Illinois last week drove home that very basic principal. I'm a proud graduate of the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, but that pride has taken another in a long list of recent hits. The U of I is beset by troubles right now – <u>in the athletic department</u>, and in its academic administration. It's <u>facing a</u> <u>lawsuit about the hiring/firing of a faculty member</u>. It's all pretty complicated and deserving of its own treatment. I bring it up here only to explain the news story I mentioned earlier. Last week, <u>emails between then-Chancellor Phyllis</u> <u>Wise and other administrators</u> became public (despite their best efforts to prevent that).

The cache of correspondence is not flattering, and I don't know where to begin on the content. But it provided a brilliant example of the virtues of AR<sup>®</sup>.

If you're a bigwig, of course, worried about scandal, it has the virtue of really keeping it between you and another person.

But apart from the CYA aspect, with all the texting and email and online surveys and Facebook memes, and posts and Tweets, the only truly interactive communication we still have is inperson conversation.

You are forced to look at the person you're about to communicate with, unlike when you're sitting at a keyboard alone, building a righteous, ironclad argument about why you're absolutely right and the other person is dead wrong. You're less likely to be glib or snarky, and you have the opportunity to correct, steer, and recalibrate in real time.

Seeing that person will probably make you measure your words more carefully. To read facial expression and body language. And the other person will have the same opportunity with you.

And if you're talking about controversial issues and making tough decisions, it's more likely that at some point, one of you will look at the other and realize, "Hmm, maybe what we're contemplating isn't such a great idea."

Moreover, it means that whatever you are discussing is important enough for you to have taken the time and trouble to be in the same room at the same time. And important things usually do merit such effort.

I'm not preaching on this one. I've done my share of stupid online responses, via e-mail or unwise and unfair Facebook comments. This is more a NOTE TO SELF: If someone says something online that concerns you and that might possibly warrant any back-and-forth, don't type a response, type a note to yourself to take the matter up the next time you're together.

And if it's not worth getting together to do that, it probably doesn't warrant the time.



# The Lost City by Alan Erhenhalt

In the introduction, he states: "Most of us in America believe a few simple propositions that seem so clear and self-evident they scarcely need to be said. Choice is a good thing in life, and the more of it we have, the happier we are. Authority is inherently suspect; nobody should have the right to tell others what to think or how to behave. Sin isn't personal, it's social: individual human beings are creatures of the society they live in. Those ideas could stand as the manifest of an entire generation in America, the generation born in the babyboom years and now in its thirties and forties (this



#### **Inaugural Motor Row Beer & Wine** Fest Coming to South Loop

SOUTH LOOP – A historic stretch of the South Loop will see its first ever beer and wine festival this Labor Day weekend, according to a news release published last week by the event's organizers.



The Motor Row Craft Beer &

Wine Fest, planned for the 1600-1800 blocks of South Wabash Avenue, will feature food and live music along with ticketed beer and wine tastings. In keeping with the area's history of car showrooms and repair shops going back more than 100 years, the festival will also include "a display of nearly 20 antique cars," according to the release.

A \$35 tasting pass will buy visitors 15 samples of beer and wine at the event. Those who don't buy passes will be asked to give a **\$5 donation to the Prairie District** Neighborhood Alliance.

The Motor Row Craft Beer & Wine Fest will run from 1 p.m. to 10 p.m. on Sept. 5-6. The beer and wine tastings will run between 2-6 p.m. both days.

# World-famous blind nude model tells all

My one minute of fame from that "Where are They Now?" video about <u>me on the Oprah Winfrey Net-</u> work last month brought up a lot of questions from friends who didn't know me back when I modeled nude for art students.

One *Safe & Sound* blog follower emailed me personally with a lot of questions, and assuming some of you other readers might have been too shy to ask, I figured I'd answer the questions here for any of you who are interested.

1. Did it bother you being nude in front of all those guys? Well for one thing, there were some female art students in class, too. And the art professors who were at my audition (yes, you have to audition to be a nude model, they want to make sure you won't freak out on your first day and waste the three-hour classtime) reassured me ahead of time that art students think of models the same way medical students think of the naked bodies they work with. "It's all very professional," they said, pointing out that a lot of the students would be freshmen and not yet very sure of themselves as artists. "Add to that the fact that they've probably never been in a room with a naked stranger before, and you'll realize they'll be a lot more nervous than you'll be." I remember wondering why we didn't **all** get naked then, you know, just to make absolutely sure the nervous playing field was level? So yes, I was a bit nervous at first, but after a while I focused more on staying still than worrying what I looked like up there.

2. How long did you have to stay very still and not move? Fifty minutes, and then I'd get a ten minute break.

3. How long do you have to sit there? Each class was three hours long, and remember, sometimes I was standing up in the same pose the entire time with just two ten-minute breaks. Teachers made it clear that if I couldn't hold a pose for the entire 50 minutes, all I had to do was call out to the teacher that I needed a break. They'd come with masking tape to mark the position my feet were in so that I'd have a better chance of striking up the identical pose when I returned. My favorite poses were the ones where I was laying down. 4. Do you think




you would have been a nude model if you still had your eye sight? No way.

5. Or did the fact you were blind enter into your decision to model at all? Yes. The ADA had been passed, but I was still out of work and pretty bummed out about it. I'd applied for jobs but by then employers had already figured out ways to avoid hiring me without mentioning anything about blindness, they knew how to avoid being sued. On Sunday evenings my husband Mike would read the want ads out loud to me. When he came to the one about needing nude models, he read it out loud as a sort of joke. I memorized the phone number without telling him and called for an audition.

6. Did you enjoy doing it or did it bother you? It was okay. A thing I didn't like about it was that I got achy sometimes, standing in one position. The good part was feeling like I was still part of the visual arts. Another thing: staying still so long gave me lots of time to think about my writing, how to reformulate a lead, how to get across a certain idea. In fact, I used that quiet time to put together my very first published essay. I composed it in my head and then typed it into my talking computer the minute I got home. Nude Modeling: Goin' In Blind was picked up by "Alternet" and published in alternative newspapers all over the country. 7. Do you still model? I quit modeling in 2003, after my memoir Long Time, No See was published and we moved from Urbana, Illinois to Chicago. In a convoluted way, the success of that essay I'd written about nude modeling led to the publication of my memoir, my appearance on Oprah, my job leading memoir-writing classes here in Chicago, my recorded essays on NPR, and this blog. So hey, I'm glad I gave it a try.

# Checkerboard City: Dense Thinking

Believe it or not, back in the early nineties, ex-mayor Richard M. Daley was planning to tear out an entire branch of the El system. "The Lake Street branch of what's now the Green Line had terrible slow zones and you could almost walk to Oak Park faster," recalls Jacky Grimshaw, the Center for Neighborhood Technology's vice president for policy. "The mayor and the CTA president wanted to take it down."

Grimshaw says this moment of crisis was the birth of Chicago's transit-oriented development (TOD) movement, a push to create dense, parking-light housing and retail near rapid-transit stations in order to reduce car dependency. CNT and the West Side community organization Bethel New Life teamed up to present the CTA with a plan for TOD near the Lake/Pulaski stop, but it fell on deaf ears.

However, after Grimshaw penned a "woodsman spare this tree" op-ed for the Tribune, Daley apparently took notice. Soon afterwards, she says, the CTA managed to find \$364 million in funding from leftover projects to pay for rehabbing the Lake Street branch.

In 2013, City Council passed its first TOD ordinance, sponsored by First Ward alderman Proco Joe Moreno. The city's zoning code generally mandates a one-to-one ratio of parking spots to housing units in new or rehabbed buildings. However, the 2013 law cuts that requirement in half for parcels within 600 feet of a rapid-transit stop, 1,200 feet on a designated Pedestrian Street, and allows higher density within these districts.

The legislation spurred a wave of development in Moreno's ward and other Northwest and North Side neighborhoods. The most visible of the new TOD towers is the 1611 West Division building in Wicker Park, which looks like a giant silver ice cube, with ninety-nine units but zero parking for residents. Other projects are currently under construction by the O'Hare Branch's California station and the Brown Line's Paulina stop, and several more TOD developments are in the planning stages. - See more at: http://



You will be receiving an email from Barbara telling you a little about herself and some of her plans.



# SOLUTIONS to avoid a budget crisis in CPS

We need a multi-pronged approach to solving the deficit at CPS.

CPS has made some poor spending decisions over the past few years, but we can't undo those. The city and state *can* move forward to make sure that our schools do not receive further drastic cuts. The future of Chicago depends on a healthy, resourced public school system. We need all stakeholders to work together to make sure schools open on time and without cuts.

There are multiple ways the city and state could raise revenue and decrease costs.

#### Raise Revenue

#### State income tax

End Double pension payment Chicago taxpayers are paying into two pension systems while the rest of the state is not paying into Chicago pensions. Estimated between \$200-\$300 million.

Chicago's share would go up if we weren't double paying.

state

Currently IL has flat tax of 3.75% (down from 5%). Every 1/4% incease yields a billion dollars in revenue. A progressive income tax would tax earners in a fair way based on ability to pay and raise more revenue.

#### Sales tax on services

Could yield \$300M for city. Indirect benefit to CPS. More options: Voices for IL Children report bit.ly/chooserev

#### TIF surplus return: \$200M to CPS

The city brought in \$422 million last year in new TIF increment. Last year there was \$1.7B in TIF accounts. New accounting will be done in July. 53% of TIF surplus goes back to CPS. The City should declare a surplus of at least \$400 million in TIF which would yield over \$200 million for CPS. This would still leave a lot of money in the TIF jar to cover expenses.

If there are questions about the status of monies in TIF accounts, the city should provide a full, transparent review of TIF projects, including contracts for committed projects and TIF district status. TIF districts that do not meet "but for the TIF definition" should be shut down.

#### Moderate property tax increase: \$100M

Currently, Chicago has a lower property tax rate than the rest of the state. As a last resort for revenue increase, CPS's property tax rate could increase by 4.4% to yield \$100M. This would need approval from the state legislature.



#### Student Housing in the Sloop: A Safe Real Estate Bet? Tuesday, August 18, 2015



We know real estate is hot all over the city, but Curbed Chicago looks at a student housing trend in the Sloop: However, it was a little surprising that just this month, two Columbia College-affiliated student housing properties have been bought and sold to investors. First, Crain's reported that the student apartment tower at 777 South State is being purchased for \$85 million. Five days later, Crain's reveals that the Dwight Lofts facility, only a few blocks away, is being purchased for \$105 million. The two purchases don't seem to be related, although both properties are privately owned come with multi-year contracts for Columbia to lease all-ormost of the units. Crain's describes both as safe investments due to the contractual lock-in with Columbia, but it's not hard to wonder if there could be something bigger going on.

Regardless of the residential market, it seems like student housing has remained pretty constant in the Sloop. We're fans of the students. We know some aren't.

Regardless, it does look like the developer of this property (on the east side of Wells) did get their permits recently (via Chicago Cityscape):

While some might complain about losing a parking lot (most likely people who have cars and use this lot) it is probably a good development as it will bring additional density to a rapidly changing street in the Sloop.
