# State Fire Marshal's Sprinkler proposal Extinquished . . . For now.

The state fire marshal has withdrawn a proposal that would have required expensive retrofits of sprinklers and new exits for many Chicago highrises.

CHICAGO – August 2, 2013. Illinois State Fire Marshal Larry Matkaitis today issued a statement regarding the proposal of the Office of the State Fire Marshal (OSFM) to update Illinois' fire safety code for the first time in more than a decade. The proposed rule will no longer be considered in front of the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR) at this time. The public hearing that was scheduled for August 6, 2013 is canceled. In the course of this process, it's become clear that any proposed state rule needs additional refinement. "Therefore today I am officially withdrawing the proposed rule before the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules to take into account substantial public comment and carefully re-examine this issue."

## Jones Ribbon-cutting Ceremony August 22nd

CHICAGO (July 30, 2013) -- Friends of Jones, the parent organization founded to support Jones College Prep High School in Chicago, is pleased to announce the opening of the school's new addition to the downtown campus.

When the 2013/2014 academic year opens on August 26, students will begin using the new building located directly south of the existing school. Designed by Chicago-based architects Perkins + Will, the sevenstory addition features a gym, library, 500-seat auditorium theater, and a handicapped-



accessible swimming pool in addition to classrooms. The existing building is also being renovated to include a fitness center, art studio and student learning center as part of a two-building campus.

A ribbon-cutting ceremony is planned for the new school on Thursday, August 22 at 5:30pm, and the public is welcome to attend.

## Mayor Emanuel Introduces Energy Use Benchmarking Ordinance <u>not</u> Embraced by All.

New Ordinance Would Require Energy Use Tracking and Reporting for approximately 3,500 Municipal, Commercial, and Residential Buildings To further cement Chicago's status as a center for sustainability and green jobs, Mayor Rahm Emanuel introduced an ordinance that would require the city's largest buildings to benchmark their energy use and authorize the City to disclose the energy efficiency for these buildings publicly. Through benchmarking and disclosure, the ordinance would spur the market for energy efficiency by encouraging building owners to make improvements, creating growth opportunities for energy service companies and contractors. "Good data drives markets and innovation," said Mayor Emanuel, "This ordinance will accelerate Chicago's growth as a capital for green jobs by arming building owners, real estate companies, energy service companies and others with the information they need to make smart, cost-saving investments." Under the proposed ordinance, the approximately 3,500 commercial, residential, and municipal buildings over 50,000 square feet would be required to track and verify energy consumption.

# Roosevelt Collection finally gets some retail

I've always <u>loved the Roosevelt Collection</u>, that condo (now rental)/movie theater/plaza-like courtyard complex just west of Clark on the Roosevelt Road bridge. I loved it since the day it opened.

I loved the way you could look north beyond the com-



plex and see a collection of breathtaking downtown buildings in the distance. I loved the 16-screen movie theater at the rear of the courtvard that was user friendly-and which sported a cocktail lounge, complete with flatbread pizza and a great view of the aforemen-

tioned buildings, as well. I loved the ersatz Miami feel it tried to blast out to passersby.

The original developers a while back promised that the complex would also have a great big park on the premises. And that it would have some retail. Then they went broke. The economy, remember? A big shopping center rescue company swooped down and bought it for a song and promised to redo, reconfigure, breathe some life into the place--and make some leases for some retail. For which there is plenty of space. And which was beginning to look plenty seedy, empty as it was for years.

The park, they decided, would be built on the rooftop of the British School--which they said would be built on the originally planned park land--riling up the neighbors. But I even liked that idea--getting a new private school in the neighborhood and the park, too!

There were <u>many news reports over many months</u> that retail was coming to liven up the plaza. And guess what? Four stores (forerunners, they say) had grand openings (Aug 1) last Thursday evening: <u>H & M; Z Gallerie; White House Black Market</u>; and <u>Ulta</u>--which was giving away huge cans of free hairspray.

Red Moon Theater members provided inexplicable entertainment for the early evening soiree. Three members walked around with huge swans on their heads. Two members donned science fiction type costumes, became human bubble making machines and walked around four food trucks lined up in the driveway--which were selling things such as grilled cheese. And one member sat in a

makeshift chandelier, got hoisted by crane over the plaza entry to the level of a huge gramophone that was also hoisted up. Big shots from the Roosevelt Collection had their picture taken in front of the crain.

I bought four packs of socks at H & M (one was free). Didn't need any furniture or accessories from Z Gallery or any high-end ladies' ready-to-wear from White House Black

# Energy Benchmarking in Chicago: Can Energy Improvements Be Legislated?

Do you know how much energy buildings consume, as a percentage of energy consumption city-wide? Do you know that the City of Chicago has goals for improving the energy efficiencies of buildings? Have you heard about the "energy benchmarking" ordinance that was recently before the City Council?

We know that data supports improvements of all kinds, including energy efficiencies. After all, you can't know how well you are improving unless you have numbers to show progress. That's what energy benchmarking is all about. The Center for Neighborhood Technology has demonstrated the power of energy benchmarking. Using energy consumption data, CNT helped buildings owned and operated by Cook County government agencies to become more energy efficient, to the tune of saving tax-payers \$3M over the past three years. (http://www.cntenergy.org/2013/06/26/energy-benchmarking-in-cook-county-buildings-shows-savings-of-3-million/)

The Alliance for a Greener South Loop supports improving the energy efficiencies of buildings and the City's sustainability plan and goals, but it does not support the current proposed ordinance that will require

the public reporting of energy usage in buildings over 50,000 sq. ft. We appreciate the efforts of **Alderman Reilly** to delay consideration of this ordinance, and thank the 11 aldermen, including **Aldermen Fioretti and Dowell**, who joined him in deferring consideration.

We question the ordinance on a number of fronts, including its financial burden on owners to implement (especially on owner residents in condo buildings) and expected outcome (what is the purpose of this ordinance?).

We support ongoing conversation about how to engage and motivate property owners to make energy efficiency improvements, and how data can support those efforts. In fact, the Alliance will be announcing a redesign of its annual Greener South Loop awards soon. This five-year old program is being revamped to challenge folks to come up with ways to engage individual South Loop residents to do something different – as a way to collectively contribute to the City's sustainability plan and goals. We believe that, as a community, the South

Loop can contribute to the city's sustainability goals by tapping into Chicagoans' innovation and creativity.

My name is Elliot Ness. I have an office in the Transportation Building, or I used to, the same building where SRO is located so I know the place well. You may not see me, but I'm there in spirit. Tom and Dino Bezanes opened SRO in 1993. It was a popular eatery for guys/ gals from the financial district. When I first walked in, I thought it looked like a Sports Bar. The boys assured me there were no barrels of "Hooch" in the basement. The wide variety of drinks are on the soft side. I like all the sports memorabilia on the walls. Great stuff for people my age. It is truly a fast food restaurant with a menu ten times better than a fast food restaurant. All the critics want McDonalds to serve healthier food. Tom and Dino discovered healthy food years ago; from a variety of salads to Mediterranean style food like the Greek Salad, to Falafel and the Hummus Platter. . . or Grilled Tuna Fitness Plate. SRO has your usual fare for fast food including a variety of burgers, Italian Beef and the Jumbo Chicago Char Dog & Fries. Do you like Chicken? Cajun Chicken Sandwich, the BBQ Chicken Sandwich, SRO Chicken Sandwich, Rookie Chicken Sandwich (w/ lettuce, tomatoe, and mayo) and the SRO Fitness Plate (SRO's famous chicken served over Rice and a side of Grilled Veggies.).

**CHICAGO (Aug. 12, 2013)** -- The Wabash Arts Corridor (WAC) Crawl will take place during EXPO ART WEEK, a showcase of the city's visual, performing and culinary arts **September 16-22**, presented in conjunction with EXPO CHICAGO, the International Exposition of Contemporary and Modern Art at Navy Pier, September 19-22.

The <u>WAC Crawl</u> is a free public event, open Wednesday, Sept. 18, from 5–8 p.m., and located along Wabash Avenue from Congress to Roosevelt. The WAC Crawl will feature gallery openings, concerts, dance and street performances, multimedia demonstrations, chalk art, sidewalk sales, discounts to area restaurants and pubs, the unveiling of the Columbia College's Papermaker's Garden and a Joffrey Ballet rehearsal performance in the storied Auditorium Theatre.



### About Buildings, Energy Efficiencies, and the City of Chicago

According to the Center for Neighborhood Technology (http://www.cntenergy.org/buildings/), Nearly 40 percent of all the energy used in the United States is used in buildings, and buildings account for a large percentage of greenhouse gas emissions...the energy consumed in buildings accounts for 70 percent of Chicago's annual greenhouse gas emissions and 61 percent of emissions in the surrounding six-county region. Investing in energy efficiency not only reduces energy costs and greenhouse gas emissions, it also improves comfort for building occupants and maintains high-quality building stock.

In 2010, the City of Chicago published a goal to cut - by 30% - the amount of energy consumed in half of Chicago's buildings, by 2020. This is part of the city's Climate Action Plan and a component of the city's comprehensive and ambitious sustainability plan. (http:// www.cityofchicago.org/city/en/progs/env/sustainable\_chicago2015.html)

To help achieve this goal, Mayor Emanuel has proposed an "energy benchmarking" ordinance that would require energy consumption (including energy consumed by individual residents) in buildings over 50,000 square feet to be publicly reported. This is tied to 2015 Sustainable Chicago's key action: "Enhance local policies to support greater transparency in energy use and building energy performance."

Want to see amendments to the ordinance that decrease the financial burden on condo and co-op owners? Send your emails and letters to Mayor Emanuel, respectfully asking the Administration to hold this measure in committee to allow for additional discussion and changes that would limit the burden on property owners of costly mandates.
