South Loop Neighbors Annual Meeting

South Loop Neighbors held their annual meeting on Thursday, Dec. 12th, 2013 at Jones College Prep High School. Richard Weindorfer, President of South Loop Neighbors, reviewed for us the events of 2013. He talked about "Re-use Jones" and how they were able to save the old building, however, not for purposes of a new neighborhood high school which many were hoping for. On two dates during the year, SLN sponsored 'Breakfast at Grace', a Saturday morning hot breakfast served to the homeless. There were two Yard Sales, one in June and one in September. There were a number of public meetings whose focus was on local development and presentations by developers and architects. There were member events which were social get-togethers at various venues. They are working with other community organizations such as the Greater South Loop Assoc. and Prairie Avenue District Neighbors Alliance. Also , SLN has assigned liaisons to now four alderman whose wards slice through the South Loop.

Dennis McClendon took over to focus on the past year's activity of building developments and other physical improvements. He spoke of the "street scaping" efforts on Harrison and Roosevelt Rd to make it more pedestrian /bike friendly. He mentioned the initiative of Columbia College to make Wabash an arts corridor (WAC). He noted the completion of Jones High School. Richard had mentioned earlier the intent of Jones College Prep to open up their facilities to the community starting next Summer. The two lots on

the south end of the block of Dearborn, 776 and 777 S. Dearborn have a plan. The "chip lot" as it is known, is currently planned to be an eight story building instead of twelve stories as originally planned. The twin lot across the street will become the architect's (Dave Talsman, goodbuildings.com) private residence, 3 or 4 stories, with retail on the first floor. No dates have been projected relating to this development. Amli Lofts have topped off at Polk and Clark. The red brick façade is now being applied to the exterior. The building at 1001 S State (SE corner) by Golub and Assoc. has had scant progress. It is anticipated ground breaking in the Spring or whenever they secure the foundation permits.

Last February, 31 little bodies sat still in their small, Montessori classroom in one of the most impoverished neighborhoods of Chicago: the Auburn-Gresham neighborhood. The children were absolutely mesmerized by Beth, her dog, and her story. Beth, Judy and the children in Oglesby's Montessori Program.

It's not every day that schoolkids get to meet a blind author who answers each and every question they have! And it's not every day that students on Chicago's South Side participate in a public Montessori program that develops their curious minds, stimulates their thirst for knowledge, and promises to encourage them to succeed in a neighborhood that makes few promises.

<u>Help kids in this South Side Chicago</u> <u>school — it won't cost you a penny</u> Children at the Oglesby Montessori School benefit from hands on and experiential learning -- like when Beth came and showed them how to read Braille. Now, our students are trying to take a huge step into that big world by building an urban farm and garden

for their community to cultivate along with them.

The Oglesby Montessori Foundation funds this alternative school choice for families on the south side of Chicago, and this garden project is one of 5 finalists in a national contest sponsored by Teach for America and Fed Ex. If we win, we'll get \$25,000 for our garden proposal.

SPOT ON: John Maloof

John Maloof ('05) transformed his life for \$400 at an auction. In 2007, the former Columbia College Chicago product design student outbid other buyers, sight unseen, for a box of 30,000 photo negatives. He hoped to score some black-andwhite stills to illustrate a book he co-authored about Portage Park, his Chicago neighborhood.

He got so much more.

The box contained the work of North Shore nanny **Vivian Maier**, who documented everyday street scenes in 1950s and '60s Chicago. She never published her work and told few people about her passion.

Maloof, then a top real estate agent for Century 21, didn't fully comprehend the significance of his discovery. But Maier mesmerized him, and his journey to uncover the woman's story led to an unexpected path in his own artistic life—as a photographer, documentary filmmaker, and curator of Maier's now-internationally acclaimed work.

Over the past six years, Maloof has traced Maier's life, talking to more than 90 people who knew the nanny behind the camera. She kept piles of boxes of negatives and audiotapes, and books stuffed with newspaper clippings. "She was an odd person," Maloof says. "Very private. Always disappearing. All the stories were consistent about her being something of a recluse." (Maier died in 2009, before receiving critical acclaim.) Fascinated by Maier's craft, Maloof educated himself about photography techniques. "I didn't even know what street photography was when I purchased [the negatives]," Maloof says. "I studied a lot of photography and read a lot of books so that I really understood." He talked to experts about Maier's ability to capture subjects in the most intimate ways, as if she wasn't even there holding a camera. Critics say her work rivals some of the greatest street photographers, including Henri Cartier-Bresson, Garry Winogrand, and Diane Arbus. Maloof discovered other boxes of Maier's work and bought as much of the collection as he could. He owns about 100,000 photos, 3,000 vintage prints, film rolls, audiotapes, clothing, and trinkets—about 90 percent of Maier's catalog—now known as the Maloof Collection.

Archiving, promoting, and preserving Maier's work is Maloof's full-time job. He has exhibited Maier's photography across the United States and Europe in cities such as New York, London, Paris, and Chicago, including a critically acclaimed show at the Chicago Cultural Center in 2010. He published a book, *Vivian Maier: Street Photographer*, in 2011.

Maloof's latest—and most ambitious—project: producing and directing a documentary film about the life and work of his muse. To secure film funding, Maloof turned to Kickstarter, a crowd-funding website. Launched in December 2010, the campaign was a massive success, raising \$105,042—more than five times the \$20,000 goal—from nearly 1,500 backers in three months. The campaign caught the attention of actor Tim Roth (Reservoir Dogs), who helped arrange the first gallery exhibition of Maier's work in Los Angeles.

Maloof partnered with Chicagoan Charlie Siskel, nephew of legendary film critic Gene Siskel, to co-direct the film, and comedian Jeff Garlin (Curb Your Enthusiasm) signed on as executive producer. Finding Vivian Maier premiered at the Toronto International Film Festival in early September, and IFC purchased the film's domestic rights.

But after six years of working to tell the story of Vivian Maier in a way she would appreciate—that is, not overhyped—Maloof, who will continue to oversee Maier's estate, is ready to move on to other projects.

"I'm a photographer and now a filmmaker," Maloof says, hinting that he has some ideas brewing for a new documentary. But, perhaps because of Maier's influence, he wants to keep those details to himself. – Andrew Greiner (BA '05)

British School to break ground in February, 2014

The British School will open its second Chicago campus in the Roosevelt Collection in September 2015, serving students from preschool through high school in a building behind the Showplace ICON Theater that was hotly contested by area residents, as reported by **DNAinfo Lizzie Schiffman**.

The Nord Anglia Education-network private school will break ground in February on a two-story school at 161 W. 9th St. in the Roosevelt Collection in time for the 2015-2016 school year, but a more concrete construction timeline isn't yet available, a spokesman for the school said Monday.

At the South Loop Neighbors community group's annual meeting Thursday, vice president of development and planning Dennis McClendon recounted the months of negotiations to keep public greenspace in the 2.2-acre lot available to South Loop residents.

"We spent a lot of our effort and energy and attention this year fighting to save the park that the Roosevelt Collection had committed to build," McClendon said at the meeting, held at Jones College Prep.

"But instead they have received approval from the city to put the British School on that site, put some landscaping up on the roof and a small playlot and dog area on another parcel north of 9th Street."

McClendon noted that South Loop Neighbors representatives would continue "trying to negotiate some sort of agreement that could be enforceable with the various parties involved to make that a public space that we can use and enjoy, even though it won't be a 'public public space,'" referring to the rooftop greenspace, as well as the indoor gymnasium and outdoor soccer field.

South Loop residents have argued that the private school, where tuition ranges from \$12,100 for a half-day nursery program to \$27,560 for a 12th-grade IB program, won't necessarily serve the surrounding community.

"What we need is another public school," South Loop parent Enrique Perez said at a June zoning committee meeting.
