## Major milestones in the South Loop in 2014

Here are a few major milestones from the South Loop that happened in 2014 that for one reason or another I never got around to writing about.

The New Skateboard Park: I complained and whined and I was right to do so, but now that it's finished, it's not so bad. The hill that the neighborhood used just north of Roosevelt and east of Michigan Avenue for sledding is still there, covered in new sodand as long as the City doesn't put any obstructions there, all should be well. Although there was foullanguage rap music emanating out of speakers on opening day that residents of neighboring buildings complained about, it seems that just happened opening day--and park people say they aren't going to let that happen again. The whole area actually appears to be a nice place to sit and relax with a cup of coffee now and then.

The end of the Historic Handiwork Circle: One of the neatest amenities in the South Loop was the Clarke House Museum's old-fashioned craft group that met the last Thursday of every month for about two-and-a-half years. The Clarke House is the oldest house in Chicago. The group was great for people like me who've been trying to finish a plain knit scarf for about 30 years and never seem to have the time or inclination. But the group is disbanding. Although there are other places in the South Loop where knitters can get together and learn from each other, not so--as far as I know--for lacemakers and other more obscure, old-fashioned crafts. But the Clarke House says it's going to offer new things in the coming year to compensate.

The Protests: The South Loop had a ton of protesters a few weeks back as the country was in protest mode in response to unarmed individuals around the country being shot to death by cops. In fact, several groups of peaceful and very committed groups came past my house at Roosevelt and State on a few occasions. The cops who accompanied the groups-there to extinguish any trouble that might erupt--seemed to far outnumber the members of the groups. That was an interesting sight to see. However, the groups went by so fast, I never got a chance to snap a picture.

The 20th Anniversary of the Chicago Homes of Dearborn Park: 2014 marked the official beginning of life in 36 single family frame homes at Roosevelt, State and Plymouth. Although there were a few early birds who built in the latter part of 1993, and a handful of latecomers who moved in in 1995, the vast majority of us (more than half who are still here) moved in and began a new life in 1994. We've seen a lot of changes in the neighborhood-once a bastion of fallow railroad tracks, SRO housing and offbeat businesses like the printing of racing forms. Those of us who could see the future knew that others would follow and live in homes, town homes, lofts and condos--and love being near great transportation, good schools, the great museums and parks of Chicago, Lake Michigan and The Loop. We celebrated our 20th anniversary in early September with a party in our alley. Storms came--and went--that evening. And like everything else that we have weathered in the last 20 years, we totally enjoyed ourselves, knowing we made the right choice to be pioneers in a place that a lot of people thought we were crazy to invest our money and time in.

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
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## Roosevelt University's Wabash Building selected as best property in nation

Roosevelt University's Wabash Building in Chicago has won the 2015 International Real Estate Federation – US Chapter (FIABCI-USA) Grand Prix d'Excellence Award. (Photo above by Tom Rossiter, VOA Associates).

One of the highest honors given annually to a single, outstanding project in America, the national award recognizes a property that embodies the best in U.S. real estate, setting the stage for the Wabash Building to be a competitor in Malaysia in May 2015 for the International FIABCI Prix d'Excellence Award.

Designed by the architectural firm of VOA Associates in Chicago, Roosevelt's mixed-use 32-story Wabash Building at 425 S. Wabash Ave., Chicago, includes student housing, student services, classroom and administrative office spaces. Opened in 2012, the 420,000 -square-foot structure is unique in that it combines five building types into a sleek and wavy glass façade that has become a notable addition to Chicago's South Loop skyline. The building acknowledges the past and celebrates the present through its fluid connections to Roosevelt's national landmark Auditorium Building. "The Wabash Building is not only an architectural gem. It is also an extremely functional addition to our Chicago Campus, which brings our community of students, faculty and staff closer together in spaces that lend themselves beautifully to positive discourse and interaction," said Roosevelt University President Chuck Middleton.





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
### Rocket Boys, A Memoir by Homer H. Hickam Jr.


If you are of a certain age, you can really relate to this story. If you're not of a certain age, it's still a fascinating story. Homer grew up in the 1950s in Coalwood, WV, a mining town. It was a company town where the company owned everything. The iconic moment in history that seemed to change everything was Sputnik, the first successful satellite launch in the world by our arch-enemy, Russia. Almost overnight, curriculum in our schools focused on science and math. Homer aspires to be a rocket scientist and recruits a few of his buddies to form the Big Creek Missile Agency. However, the book is not just about rockets. It's about coming of age, family dynamics, sibling rivalry, coal mining and the increasing influence of the unions, and social change. They listened to the same music as other kids in the country because of high wattage radio stations like WLS Chicago. And they could see what kids were wearing in Philadelphia because of American Bandstand. The Big Creek Missile Agency started out with crude attempts to fashion a rocket and made rockets of increasing sophistication.

Auk I top altitude was six feet. Auk XXXI top altitude was 31,000 feet. The drama in this story is the perseverance required to overcome barriers and setbacks. The success they enjoyed was how they managed to find ways to find the materials to move to the next level and how the town became their partner as the missiles became more sophisticated. Homer Hickam eventually went on the work for NASA.






We also received lots of positive comments when Mike took you along on his morning commute. We live in Printers Row, a Chicago neighborhood so close to the Loop that Mike walks to work.

Squash and Bean Vines on the south wall of the Transportation building, Printers Row Park.




A message from Susan Ohde and the Park #543 Community Garden Group.



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
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### **Newcity's Top 5 of Everything 2014**

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## UPDATE: CMK Companies Buys Lots of Land in South Loop

Last year we alerted you to the fact that two hot pieces of land in the South Loop were up for sale, one of which was right on the Chicago River and this week news broke that one of those parcels of land, the riverfront one in fact, sold at auction to CMK Development for \$7.75 million. The 1.8 acre lot at 800 South Wells is currently a surface parking lot and includes 158 feet of river frontage. With the Wells-Wentworth Connector project likely to bring lots of new traffic down South Wells, the piece of land is likely to transform from a forgotten parking lot off of a dead-end street to a premium piece of real estate on a new thoroughfare and one of the last opportunities to develop new river frontage in the downtown area.

Meets need of rapidly growing neighborhood.

The \$26M purchase of the **5.1 acres** to the south of the 1.8 acre lot they'd previously bought at auction now gives them ownership of a continuous stretch of riverfront land along Wells Street from Roosevelt Road all the way to the River City condos.

This huge land grab puts CMK in a powerful position to build a sizeable development in a corner of the South Loop that, until recently, seemed completely abandoned. It's clear that the promise of the Wells-Wentworth Connector bringing new life into the area is attracting attention from developers. We can't wait to see what CMK has planned for this land.

## Golub, Block 37 developer start South Loop apartment tower



Golub & Co. has teamed up with the owner of the Block 37 mixed-use complex to build a 41-story apartment high -rise in the South Loop, joining the pack of developers putting up multifamily towers in the city.

The joint venture between Chicago-based Golub and Los Angeles-based CIM Group has begun work on the 397-unit project at **1001 S. State St.**, which will cost about \$130 million to build, said Golub President and CEO Michael Newman. The venture is moving forward before lining up a construction loan but is in talks with lenders interested in financing the development and probably will have a loan lined up in the next month or so, he said. "We didn't want it to hold up our groundbreaking," he said.

It's the second big apartment development in Chicago for CIM, which bought the Block 37 shopping center on State Street in the Loop in 2012 and began construction this fall on <u>a 690-unit apartment tower</u> on top of it—the biggest multifamily project in the Loop in decades.

As for the South Loop, the neighborhood "possesses the attributes that fit CIM's longstanding investment model, one that focuses on urban districts positioned for economic expansion with solid infrastructure and transportation networks," CIM Principal Avi Shemesh said in a statement





# New Apartment Tower Replacing Ugly South Loop Garage

The parking garage at the corner of Clark and Harrison will be getting demolished and replaced with a **24-story apartment building**, according to a plan reported by Crain's Chicago Real Estate Daily just before the New Year. The Thomas Roszak designed tower includes **202 units** and 3,000 square feet of retail on the ground floor. As designed, the plan won't require a zoning change, so the proposal should be able to slip through the approval process barring any neighbor objections. With 58 planned parking spots, most likely reserved for residents, some neighbors may regret the loss of the public parking garage, but with South Clark already seeing two new apartment projects beginning in 2014 the community should be getting used to the idea of residential infill.

The project is lead by Dan and Michael Moceri, who along with Roszak are also behind West Loop's JeffJack apartments, citing the younger tech worker crowd's propensity for renting and desire to live as close to downtown as possible. The stretch of South Clark Street between Harrison and Roosevelt has already seen JDL-designed 1000 South Clark begin construction and AMLI Lofts just completing in recent months, bringing hundreds of new homes to the street that had sat stagnant since the previous construction boom. There remains a few under-developed parcels on the street, technically part of the Printer's Row community of the South Loop, which could start looking more and more tempting to developers as the market heats up.


### City of Chicago Offers Christmas Tree Recycling From January 3 – January 17

# South Loop Bank Robbed By 'Play Along Bandit,' FBI Says

CHICAGO — The FBI believes a man responsible for robbing at least five banks around Chicago in the last three months struck again Friday in the South Loop.

The man, who has been dubbed the "Play Along" Bandit robbed First American Bank, 1241 S. Wabash Ave. Friday, according to the FBI.

Shortly before 6 p.m., a black man with a goatee walked into the bank, handed the bank teller a note and walked out of the bank with an unspecified amount of cash, said Officer Bari Lemmon, a Chicago Police spokesman.

The man did not display or imply that he had a gun, Lemmon said.

According to the FBI, the man is about 5-foot-8 and between the ages of 25-30 and usually has his head covered during robberies.

### Taxi Reform

For years taxi drivers have suffered. They have suffered from higher gas prices, higher fees imposed for taxi cab companies and higher penalties from the City of Chicago.



For decades, the taxi industry here in Chicago has had more and more

fees imposed upon it by City regulations. With the recent popularity of nascent ride sharing companies, this meant the taxi industry was struggling to keep pace with the cost of doing business.

Some reports estimate that some taxi drivers were earning less than the minimum wage.

So, the Chicago City Council voted to scale back some of the fees to give hard working taxi drivers a fair shot at competing in today's landscape. The ordinance passed today will:

1. Reduce the maximum administrative fine the City could levy against drivers from \$1,000 to \$400.

Lower the lease cost that drivers pay if they don't own their medallions.

### **Ban on Choke Hold by Peace Officers**

A few weeks ago, I joined Aldermen Edward M. Burke (14th), Carrie Austin (34th) and Michelle Harris (8th) in proposing an ordinance that would ban all law enforcement officers from using controversial choke holds when subduing suspects and other individuals in Chicago.

The prohibition would extend to all peace officers serving within the city limits of Chicago, including Chicago police officers, deputy sheriffs, U.S. Marshals and private security guards.

The measure was introduced to the Committee on Finance following days of protests across the nation stemming from a New York grand jury's decision not to charge a white police officer in the choke hold-related death of Eric Garner, 43.

Garner, an unarmed African-American man who suffered from asthma, died in July after repeatedly telling police that he could not breathe after he was subdued, according to a videotape seen worldwide.

Under the proposal, "No peace officer, private security contractor, or private security personnel shall apply a choke hold in the performance of his or her duties, unless faced with a situation in which the use of deadly force is justified under applicable law. A choke hold shall include, but is not limited to, any pressure to the throat or windpipe, which may prevent or hinder breathing or reduce intake of air."


