DEVELOPING THE WABASH ARTS CORRIDOR

As if heralding in a "New Era," Columbia College hosted a standing room only crowd at the Hilton Chicago, of local community activists and organizations, representatives of local educational institutions, Business Partners, instructors and students, Mayor Rahm Emanuel and Alderman Fiorretti. The emphasis was to celebrate Wabash Street present and future. It was not overlooked that Wabash Street and environs was in a downward spiral as a gritty near south neighborhood and home to run down buildings and deteriorating infra-structure twenty years ago. It cleaned up nicely with the help of Columbia College buying up and renewing real estate, the Hilton Chicago Hotel deciding to stay in the South Loop and restore the grandeur of their hotel, and the city making an investment in re-streeting improvements. New businesses have moved in including many new restaurants and grocery stores . Now it is the vision of the WAC (Wabash Arts Corridor) Committee to ratchet it up a notch and make a bold statement with involvement of community members.

- 19 galleries, special collections, visual and sculptural installations
- Over 30,000 students with 5000 in residence halls

Mayor Backs Wabash Arts Corridor

Mayor Rahm Emanuel announced a plan on Wednesday to partner with Columbia College Chicago and other South Loop organizations to create public art under the umbrella of the Wabash Arts Corridor, a stretch of Wabash from Congress to Roosevelt. Mayor Emanuel called the dynamic arts corridor an integral part of the newly created City of Chicago Cultural Plan.

"The Wabash Arts Corridor puts into action two major goals of the City's Cultural Plan. First, coordinating our cultural and educational assets, and second, to leverage them in a way that benefits our children's education and spurs local businesses," said Mayor Emanuel. "I have seen firsthand the power the arts can have to transform a neighborhood economically as well as culturally."

Columbia College President Warrick L. Carter reiterated the sentiment, stating, "The Wabash Arts Corridor is a powerful concept that can help bring together the residents, businesses and institutions of this district and allow us to leverage our creative assets in a very exciting and palpable way. This collaboration with the city certainly has put the project on the fast track toward further developing the South Loop into a dynamic arts space including murals, sculptures, image projections, concert series, and more long-term projects."


The public forum also served as the unveiling for concepts of the next Wabash Arts Corridor project, a series of large-scale photographs to be installed on the exterior of the iconic Hilton Chicago, 720 S. Michigan Ave. The images are being developed by Columbia College's photography department with original student works to be

installed in May 2013.

Other projects in the Wabash Arts Corridor include an aerosol art mural at the northwest corner of Balbo and Wabash Ave. by Columbia College Chicago alumnus and Chicago-based artist Nino Rodriguez (B.A. '05) and the Columbia College'sPapermaker's Garden. Photography

and English students will soon collaborate on creating images and text to be installed on the support beams for the Red Line El tracks on Harrison St.

It wasn't until page 180 of <u>Gold Coast Madam</u> that I found a South Loop connection to my new best friend, the famous Gold Coast madam <u>Rose Laws</u>. But it was there. "In the 90s we had a three-bedroom penthouse apartment with a large balcony at River City, 800 S. Wells Street. This very recognizable, curvy building on the Chicago River was practically a city within itself. Inside the building there was a grocery store, pharmacy, dry cleaners, doctor's office, gym. Almost anything you could ever need was conveniently right there. We had a really talented and hardworking girl at this apartment. When she had dates with men, they never wanted to leave when their hour was up. We made a deal with her to keep the other girls in line. She also did the laundry

and helped the maid clean. She was sort of a house mom, if you will, and stayed six months. She would take two days off a week so she could explore the city. She loved

the arrangement and it worked out well for us too. Everything was fine in River City until some girls solicited the valet help downstairs. Needless to say we were thrown out of the building."

So I exaggerate when I say Rose is my best friend. Although at one time, we were sort of neighbors. <u>River City</u> is a mere hop, skip and jump from my home at Roosevelt and State. I've been there many times and have always admired the <u>Bertrand Goldberg</u> concoction of a building. One of the quirks? Many of the units' windows face inward and over an enclosed atrium, nary a bit of fresh air to be had.

Rose and I met just once, in fact--at a book signing thrown for her at <u>Nisei Lounge</u> at Newport and Sheffield last Sunday. I'd been reading her book and wanted to meet her in person. She's 78-years-old now. And what a life she's had! The book is quite interesting and I highly recommend it.

Laws was born in rural Tennessee. You would be hard-pressed not to call her a "hillbilly." Her father was no good, very mean, had plenty of non-secret girlfriends and didn't support the family. Her mother was long-

suffering. Rose married an abusive husband who she met while he was serving in the military. She had five kids in quick succession; her husband beat her but he didn't drink or cheat. She left him. Her kids ended up in an orphanage and in foster care. And for all practical purposes, Rose used her own sexuality--and the sexuality of others to make a lot of money, get her kids back and do right by her family.

The men in her life couldn't wait to shower her with cash, many simply because they liked her, felt kind of sorry for her or just considered her a fun friend. Her long-term romantic relationships were often like long-term business partnerships, the terms of which she proposed as soon as she set her sights on someone she thought would get it. More often than not, she was right. They got it.

Her journey through life put her in the same social whirl as many famous mobsters--some named, some not. At a certain point, Rose leveled with her kids--four boys and a girl--about how she made a living and to one degree or another, they accepted it all and even helped the family business thrive in one way or another.

Rose has a cute way of talking about her own sex life here and there throughout the book, which she wrote with <u>writer Dianna Harris</u>. The sexy twinkle in Laws' eye jumps out of her words--and right off the page.

Rose got in big trouble twice. When the state came down on her the first time in 1988, she didn't serve any time. But when the feds came-a-calling in 2002, she ended up in federal prison. She tried engag-

ing in a number of legitimate businesses throughout her life but nothing seemed to turn out right. Only being "an agent," as she likes to say, worked for her.

British School Proposal (from South Loop Neighbors Newsletter)

The owner of the Roosevelt Collection is proposing to construct a building for the British School instead of the park that current zoning requires. The developer showed drawings of the school at a meeting on Tuesday, March 5th, at St. Ignatius College Prep, 1076 W. Roosevelt.

When the Roosevelt Collection retail center was approved, the Planned Development Ordinance (PDO) required construction of a "grand staircase" allowing access from the north and a two-acre "publicly available open space." Now the owner proposes to amend the PDO, to allow construction of a new building for the British School on the park parcel. That building would have some rooftop landscaping, reached by a narrow four-story stairway that would be controlled by the shopping center. In addition, an artificial-turf playing field is proposed west of the

school building, but it is unclear who would control it's access, besides it seems that the British School would have exclusive use of the site during school or practice hours.

Future residential development will make it even more important to have a real, ground-level park since the Roosevelt Collection already has approval for a residential high-rise next to the movie theater, and can build another 500 units on the land north of the park, between Polk and 9th.


