



The new Jones College Prep opens its doors to the neighborhood--but only for one night

It was one glorious evening. South Loopers got to see the new and very gleaming and very impressive <u>Jones College Prep</u>, which opened its doors to us so we could see our South Loop TIF dollars at work. As well as the many dignitaries on hand.

Then the door banged shut again. Our TIF dollars or not. If you want to come back, test in! Compete with your fellow Chicagoans, South Loopers. Thousands upon thousands of them.

But enough of the old stuff. It's over. The new Jones College Prep opened Monday for business. And the South Loop still has no neighborhood high school. The neighborhood spoke out and saved the old school, which is adjacent to the new one. But it's not going to be a neighborhood high school. It's going to add more space to Jones College Prep, which is open to every student in the city, as long as they can pass a rigorous test. If you want to raise high schoolers in the South Loop, and your kids are not geniuses, you better have plenty of money to send them to a private school.

So here are some of the highlights. The school is sort of like a high school version of the East Bank Club. Dance studio--check! Huge gym--check! Huge swimming pool on the top floor--check! Fitness Center--check! Lots of locker rooms--check! And there are lots of beautiful outdoor terraces for eating and socializing and such, interspersed on the seven floors --the best one being the one on seven that has a vista down Balbo toward Lake Michigan that is breathtaking. Check!

Then there's lots of stuff for mingling with the arts. Like big art studios, choral rooms, musical instrument rooms and the good sized Robin Bennett Theater--which is where the ribbon cutting was, and which rivals the world-famous <u>Steppenwolf Theater</u> on Halsted Street in terms of amenities.

The cafeteria ain't too shabby, either. Nor is the enormous library. Or the computer labs, the science labs and last but not least, the actual classrooms which are sort of like afterthoughts. Many of the floors around the school are made of terrazzo. Some of concrete. And there are four elevators that go from one to seven that students can only use if they are unable to get up the stairs on their own.

Three personal memories of Jones came into my mind. (There has been <u>a school called "Jones"</u> on the site at Harrison, Plymouth and State since 1875.) My memories are all from the era when it was called Jones Commercial, which was housed in what is now considered the "old" building.



In 1972, I was a substitute teacher there. And I remember my students (mostly girls who were studying subjects such as typing, shorthand and bookkeeping that would enable them to work in

business offices) were dressed beautifully; they all had downtown internships at some point during the day. They were incredibly personable and professional. I took pictures of them with my new Nikon, complete with tons of fresh Tri-X 400. And many years later, when I married my second husband—a journalist and photographer most of his life—he finally developed the contact sheets for me. And all the memories of the days spent with those lovely teenaged girls flooded back.

Shortly after I moved into my house at Roosevelt and State in 1994, the principal of Jones Commercial, who lived near me in <u>Dearborn Park</u> invited me over for a visit. It was fun to be back after 22 years. She begged me to be on <u>the Jones LSC</u>, which was a new concept back then. I didn't want to disappoint her so I said OK. Another board in my life? So what....

Then she asked me to come introduce myself in a few weeks to the teachers. When I got there, I realized there was going to be a hard-fought and very contested election. And that was the last thing I was interested in. A lot of people really wanted to be on the LSC--so what'd she need me for? But I did stay and introduce myself and I told the story of my substitute teaching way back whenand the lovely girls I met in 1972. Although I had absolutely no interest in running for the LSC. Last but not least, after I became a lawyer in 1993, I was asked to coach a trial team at Jones. CPS and the Cook County Circuit Court host a fierce competition among high schools; the students learn the basics of being prosecutors, defense lawyers and judges (not to mention victims and defendants). The students learn the skiils of direct and cross examination, opening statements, closing arguments and jury instructions in "Street Law" classes. (Why they call it this I can't figure out.) In any case, my Jones team always did pretty well--and was never eliminated in the first round. They always placed. It was truly amazing to see how some kids were just naturals and how easy it was for them to pick up trial skills. (Maybe from watching a lot of law-related TV?) And many were great actors, too--playing witnesses who took the stand during the trial. In any case, on the eve of the official opening of the

In any case, on the eve of the official opening of the new Jones College Prep building, these memories flooded my mind. Even though in this era Jones will only educate the cream of the crop in the city-students who will utilize all the health club amenities and educational opportunities at their disposal--it's important to remember that there was school life on that land for the last 138 years. I hope one of those accidental classrooms at least pays lip service to the history beneath their feet. Bonnie McGrath








3. How did you choose Printers Row and did you have any other locations?



WABASH ARTS CORRIDOR CRAWL SHOW-CASES SOUTH LOOP'S DYNAMIC CREATIVE COMMUNITY DURING EXPO ART WEEK

The <u>WAC Crawl</u> is a free public event, open Wednesday, Sept. 18, from 5–8 p.m., and located along Wabash Avenue from Congress to Roosevelt. The WAC Crawl will feature gallery openings, concerts, dance and street performances, multimedia demonstrations, chalk art, side-

walk sales, discounts to area restaurants and pubs, the unveiling of the Columbia College's Papermaker's Garden and a Joffrey Ballet rehearsal performance in the storied Auditorium Theatre.

The WAC Crawl is the latest development of the Wabash Arts Corridor, a long-term partnership between the city and local business community to transform empty storefronts, parking lots, walls and vacant land in the South Loop into a dynamic, creative community that will serve as a gateway to the South Loop. Recent developments include an installation of large-scale fashion photography on the exterior of the Hilton Chicago; a mural project on George's Lounge (650 S. Wabash); the Harrison Gateway.haikus on the El Track support beams. Ave.xpansion of the Papermaker's Garden across from the Hilton Chicago; and updating the façade of 619 S. Wabash.

"The WAC Crawl is going to be a dynamic celebration of the cultural and educational life of the South Loop," said Mark Kelly vice president of student affairs at Columbia College, and one of the driving forces behind the WAC Initiative. "This area is home to more than 30,000 students, 17 major cultural organizations and a thriving business community. The WAC Crawl is going to unleash the creative energy and assets of this community and use it to transform the South Loop into a major tourist destination."

CITY HALL — The city released the locations Friday of 50 speed cameras that will be operational at schools and parks by the end of the year including Jones College Prep.

"The Children's Safety Zone Program protects children and other pedestrians by reminding motorists to slow down and obey speed laws — particularly in school and park zones," said Transportation Commissioner Gabe Klein.

Critics have called them a cash stream for the city. After an initial 30-day warning period at each location, speeders will be ticketed \$35 for going 6-10 mph over the posted limit, or \$100 for more than that.

What About Bob?

Second Ward Alderman Robert "Bob" Fioretti got a raw deal in last year's ward remap. His district currently includes portions of several neighborhoods on the Near South and Near West sides, but in 2015 his territory will flip to the Near North Side, which means he has to win over a whole new set of voters in the next election. Perhaps because he has an uphill reelection battle anyway, lately he's had no qualms about going against the mayor's wishes on issues ranging from charter schools to the renegotiation of the city's reviled parking-meter contract. As part of a series of interviews with aldermen about their view on transportation issues, I recently had coffee with Fioretti downstairs from his law firm, a stone's throw from the Dearborn protected bike lanes. I thought you did a great job speaking out against the meter deal reboot. Your opposition was mainly financial, right, that Chicago Parking Meters could be making even more money from extended meter hours on other days? One, they were still getting a good deal out of it. Two, it was almost as if we were putting the nail in the coffin for the long term here. It was a bad deal in the first place and now we're ratifying it by making amendments to the contract. We've leased our sovereignty to an outside entity, and that has a negative impact on many things we do in the city. - See more http://newcity.com/2013/06/18/ checkerboard-city-what-about-bob/#more-8711

MAYOR EMANUEL BREAKS GROUND FOR CERMAK AVENUE GREEN LINE STATION

New Station Near McCormick Place Part of \$92 Million in CTA Station Developments that will Foster Economic Growth Throughout the Near South Side

Mayor Rahm Emanuel and local officials broke ground on the new Cermak Green Line station, a \$50 million construction project that will energize the area around McCormick Place and provide a crucial additional transportation option for the Near South Side. The \$50

million station is part of \$92 million in overall transportation investments, including the rehabilitation of the Roosevelt and Harrison stations on the Red Line and the 18th Street Connector, which will significantly revitalize the near south side of the city. "We are building a new station to serve McCormick Place and the surrounding area," said Mayor Rahm Emanuel. "We are improving our infrastructure to brighten our economic future. You cannot have a 21st century economy sitting on a 20th century economic infrastructure."

"The new Cermak-McCormick Place station will offer a convenient transit option for commuters, residents, employees and visitors, and at the same time help support economic development well under way in the community," said CTA President Forrest Claypool. Since taking office, Mayor Emanuel has worked extensively to help McCormick Place Harrison Red Line station, 608 S. State


