Papermaker's Garden



An unveiling ceremony for Columbia College Chicago's expansion of the <u>Papermaker's Garden</u>, located at 754 S. Wabash Avenue, was one of the highlights in the <u>Wabash Arts Corridor Crawl</u> on Sept. 18.

The 18-bed garden and tree plantings will act as a mini local habitat for wildlife. It also includes a rainwater capture cistern system which will reduce the amount of water used for the garden. The new garden also includes a covered multipurpose performance area.

"Not only does the Papermaker's Garden transform a gravel lot into an urban garden, it showcases the natural, sustainably grown fibers for papermaking as a part of our academic curriculum and sustainability initiatives," said Alicia Berg, vice president of campus environment at Columbia College. "It also becomes a highly visible alternative site to present art and performances in the Wabash Arts Corridor (WAC)."

At the ceremony, students were in the garden demonstrating papermaking techniques, giving out handmade paper samples, and answering questions about the process and the space.

The Papermaker's Garden opened in June 2012, featuring a variety of plants grown to be used as papermaking fiber and art material in the Columbia College Chicago Center for Book & Paper Arts studios. It also supports deep, hands-on engagement with the process of fiber production as well as an interdisciplinary practice related to art, science, the environment and social practice.

SOUTH LOOP — Three teenage girls were arrested after they attacked two women with pepper spray, police said. The teens approached a 24-year-old woman about 10:20 p.m. Wednesday, 9/25/13 in the 1100 block of South State Street and assaulted the woman with pepper spray, said Officer Amina Greer, a police spokeswoman. Ten minutes later, the teens attacked a 26 -year-old woman two blocks away at 1300 South State Street. Greer said.



Police caught up with the girls a short time after the attack at 1800 South State Street and arrested them. Charges in the attacks were pending as of Thursday morning, and police said they were still investigating why the teens attacked the women. I was tickled to discover my <u>What's it Like to go</u> <u>Blind segment</u> up on <u>The</u> <u>Good Stuffchannel</u> this week.

Funny thing, though. I can't see the video!

I can **hear** the show on YouTube, though, and, really, all you have to do is listen to know how much fun my Seeing Eye Dog Whitney and I had earlier this month when four guys from *The Good Stuff* <u>spent an afternoon</u> with us taping this week's segment. Friends and family members who have seen the finished product on *The Good Stuff* this week have written me and posted links on Facebook – they all give the <u>What's it Like to Go</u> <u>Blind segment</u> a hearty thumbs-up.

Craig Benzine, the guy who conducted my interview on *The Good Stuff*, is very familiar with YouTube: he already has an uber-popular blog there called <u>Wheezy</u> <u>Waiter</u> that has half a million followers. In a <u>blog post on</u> <u>Wheezy Waiter</u>, he explained why he decided to start The Good Stuff channel now, too:

"There's this type of entertainment I enjoy that I can only really find in podcast form, specifically from the shows <u>Radiolab</u> and <u>This American Life</u>. They take a topic and delve into it from all sides. That could be short stories, news stories, stand up comedy, interviews, etc. These shows give me a certain feeling when I'm done listening to them that I really don't find much on YouTube. I guess it's sort of a feeling that everything's connected and you can find interesting things

and people everywhere you look. With The Good Stuff, we're attempting to get at that feeling, at least a little, and do it with video."

The theme for the show I'm on this week is Senses. Before shooting a single frame for my segment, Craig and fellow Good Stuff staff members Sam Grant, Matt Weber and David Wolff spent nearly an hour figuring out the ideal way to film inside our apartment, which angle to shoot from and where the lighting would look best. From what my husband Mike Knezovich says, their fussiness was worth it. "They make our apartment look great!" he marveled. The Good Stuff puts tons of time and scientific research into all its video segments, and this one does not disappoint. A graphic of the inside of an eyeball shows up on screen while I explain retinopathy (the disease that caused my blindness), they got down on Whitney's level to film shots of her working outside, and they fade to black at appropriate times while I try to explain how I picture things I can't see.

The video sounds good, too. Mischievous music that sounds like it's from a Three Stooges episode plays while I take Whitney out to "empty," and if you listen closely you'll hear me playing Duke Ellington's C Jam Blues on the piano for a few seconds, too.

But wait. Why describe all this to you? You all can <u>check</u> <u>out the What It's Like to Go Blind video http://</u> <u>www.youtube.com/watch?v=8FiWKuV0svI&desktop_uri=%</u> <u>2Fwatch%3Fv%3D8FiWKuV0svI&app=desktop</u> yourself. If you like what you see/hear, I hope you'll <u>consider donating</u> <u>to The Good Stuff</u> <u>https://subbable.com/goodstuff</u>. The videos on The Good Stuff are all available free of charge, staff members fund their work with day jobs: waiting tables, doing other film work, and one guy works at a family shoe store. Craig says they feel fortunate and extremely grateful to have received a grant from Google earlier this year, but that money will run out soon, and it sure would be swell to keep The Good Stuff going. Just think. With our help, The Good Stuff can get even better.



Apartment Development

As reported by <u>Crain's Chicago Business</u>. The math shows that supply and demand already are getting out of whack. Developers will complete an average of 2679 apartments downtown this year and next, according to Appraisal Research. The consulting firm's quarterly survey covers an area bounded roughly by North Avenue, Cermak Road and Ashland Ave, and focuses on larger buildings. But in the last four quarters, a key measure of demand, absorption – the change in the number of occupied downtown apartments – has totaled 975 units. Annual absorption downtown has averaged 1348 units over the last three years, about half the increase in supply forecast in 2013 and 2014.





Marianos at 1615 S. Clark St. is on track to open Oct 8th. Windows are being installed, parking lot striped and accepting applications for employment.



The 1001 S. State Bulding will be 41 stories (80 ft. taller than the Astoria Tower, 33 residential floors (12 units per floor). The base of the building will cover most of the lot and be 6 stories high to accommodate the indoor parking (entrance off of 9th near alley) and retail space on the first floor. The design allows for a plaza at the corner of State and 9th. They would like a restaurant there. The tower will be set back from 9th. View here from the Southwest.



The Amli Lofts shown left and top. Each tower will be 12 stories w/11,000 sq. ft. of green space. Set back for Polk St is 12 feet for retail, 17 feet for tower. On Clark St. 5 ft setback for retail. The South Tower is similar except Clark St. setback is 3 ft from right of way, side-walks 9—11 ft wide.



According to Dennis McClendon of South Loop Neighbors, the Old Colony Building was approved for redevelopment by the Plan Commission which will begin in a few months.

He also reports that the CHIP LOT development which allows for a 12 story building to be built sometime in 2015 at Polk and Dearborn is still a live project.

The Chicago Oyster House

Around mid- May 2013, the owners of Triad Sushi have rebranded their restaurant into a primarily Seafood restaurant complimented with sushi offerings. They remained at the same restaurant location, at the corner of Indiana and 19th Street. The restaurant has the same Modern interior décor, friendly service staff and similar upbeat, house music playing overhead, but not so loud that you can't have a conversation. The space now has an Oyster Bar to the left as you enter and the main restaurant is through the hallway to the right. Private rooms are available with a reservation. For those who would like a small, intimate meal, a small, secluded room is available and made private with a curtained doorway. Private parties can be held in a Private party room. Street parking available along Indiana; no valet parking offered. The Michigan bus (#4) stops across the street.



This visit I used a \$15 Groupon which entitled me to a 1.1 lb lobster which was cooked to perfection and delivered quickly. The menu shows a \$30 charge for grilled or steamed; still a good value without Groupon. The server mentioned that one needs to call for reservation if you want lobster so they can order enough lobsters for the night. I also took advantage of their Oyster Bar Happy Hour which entitles you to 6 oysters for \$16. I ordered the COH Grilled and the ICHI Grilled Oysters – and both were wonderful selections. I would definitely return for such a fabulous dinner!



The menu offers a healthy mix of new seafood offerings like *Oysters, shrimp, crab, tuna tartar, mussels-and clams, calamari and scallops.* Some of the old Triad sushi favorites were retained, which include creative Maki rolls with raw fish such as tuna, salmon, yellowtail, unagi, crab and shrimp.

Some of my favorite appetizers are: <u>Shrimp Shu-mai</u> are a taste treat, the <u>Soft Shell Crab</u> is wonderful, the <u>Gyoza</u> dumplings are pan fried and served with a zesty soy sauce and the delightful <u>Asparagus beef roll</u> includes thinly sliced beef wrapped around steamed asparagus spears and is complimented house made Teriyaki sauce.

Some of my other favorites include the <u>Spider</u> <u>Maki</u> - lightly battered soft shell crab and cucumber roll - not raw. The *Miso soup and Edamame* dishes are also yummy.

All in all, I can't wait to go back enjoy another meal with my friends! I'm already planning my return!
