

#### Monday, October 29, 2018 Sun Times: Could new CPS ratings halt South Loop H.S., save National Teachers Academy?

Some new news on the South Loops public schooling options (via SunTimes):

New Chicago Public Schools ratings released Friday are threatening to derail a controversial plan to open a high school at the South Loop site of a top-performing elementary that would be shuttered under the plan.

CPS officials have assured parents for years that they wouldn't close a school unless its students were guaranteed a place in a higher-performing school. National Teachers Academy parents were told the same when they were assigned to South Loop Elementary as NTA closes to make way for a new high school in the booming South Loop.

But the updated ratings unveiled Friday show that South Loop Elementary has fallen a level according to the School Quality Ratings Policy — from the top rating, Level 1+, to Level 1, while NTA remained at Level 1+.

NTA's parents, who've waged a fierce battle against the closing at public hearings and through a lawsuit filed in Cook County Circuit Court, hope the news saves their school from a closing one grade at a time as the proposed new high school welcomes its freshman class in September.

Despite this plans appear to be moving forward:

District spokesman Michael Passman said officials have no plans to change course.

"South Loop is a proven school that remains in good academic standing, and school leadership are working to ensure the school returns to the Level 1+ status it has earned in every previous school year," he said in an email. "The decision to transition NTA to a high school was made in February following extensive community engagement and in compliance with all legal requirements. As the transition moves forward, we will continue to meet all legal requirements and work closely with the NTA and South Loop communities to promote a successful transition that benefits all students. We will see what - if anything - happens here.



## Don't call it antisemitism when it's paranoid schizophrenia, Oct 4, 2018

My <u>dad</u> used to say that in Englewood before the war--all white and ethnic back then--the neighborhood kids used to snicker when the rumors started spreading that Hitler was killing Jews. "They were kind of happy that he was getting rid of some Jews," my dad used to say, which was his way of explaining why he thought some of the kids in his Chicago neighborhood were stupid idiots.

They didn't kill any Jews but they may have teased the few Jews who lived in Englewood about the Fuhrer who was. And they may have fantasized about getting even with Jews, who seemed to always do a little better, earn a little more and be a bit more in the know than the majority of the neighborhood.

And they just may have whispered to each other that Jews were known to drink baby's blood. And that they killed Jesus --even thought he was a Jew, too--their eyes widening and them shrieking like they would at a horror movie.

A lot of kids back in my dad's neighborhood were hateful and antisemitic. They learned it from their parents who talked, perhaps, about the baby's blood, the killing of Jesus and why in the hell the Jews owned all the stores in the neighborhood and were running all the banks in Chicago and.....

They used words like "kike" and "dirty Jew." Maybe Hebe? But I'm not sure if that insult was in vogue in Englewood yet.

The garage door above is a good example of common antisemitism. As is the latest from that big dope of an antisemite, religious leader Louis Farrakhan, <u>calling Jews</u> "termites." Which is mild compared to the things he usually says.

Some Muslims are antisemitic because they think Jews were unjustifiably given the land of Israel they were driven from very, very, very long ago, among other things, and aren't justified in getting it back now. From them.

Antisemitism has been around for 6,000 years, at least. Since the biblical Abraham declared that by cutting off little pieces of each other's penises--which symbolized a covenant with God--that Jews (the men at least) were the Chosen People. Other people got jealous and resentful, I presume, with claims like that. And if you read the commentary from God in the bible about the Jews being chosen, it's easy to understand why people developed that resentment. And the muddled reports from back then as to who killed Jesus (Jews? Romans? Or?) didn't help.

Antisemitism has persisted. It springs from jealousy. And suspicions about minorities, Jews being perceived as smarter and richer and more shrewd than others. And the persistent possibility that they killed Jesus keeps living in peoples' minds.

The horrors in Nazi Germany stemmed from the feeling that Jews, a tiny, tiny minority, had everything they wanted in Germany and then some, and the poor Germans had to bring a barrelful of money to the post office to buy a stamp.

The signs my mom used to see in Miami hotels in the 1940s, "No dogs or Jews allowed," stemmed from..... I don't know. The idea that Jews killed Jesus, that they were richer and more ostentatious than others; and that they were smarter, too? "And if they're so smart,



let 'em go stay somewhere else. Who needs them?"

People can be mean just like mean girls can be mean.

Harry <u>Truman's wife (and mother-in-law) would not allow Jews</u> <u>in Harry's home</u>. And the wasps who ran country clubs wouldn't allow Jews--so Jews decided to start their own in order to golf and swim. This kind of antisemitism stemmed from tribalism and feelings of superiority stemming from feelings of inferiority. Fear and loathing of "the other," is a big motivator in meanness and lack of understanding. And antisemitism.

And so it goes. Jews had years and years (and maybe still do) of not being wanted in the workplace--from law firms to corporate board rooms to the secretarial pool to the retail emporiums. Tribalism, the motivator. When a gentile brought someone they wanted to marry into their home who was Jewish, all Hell could break loose. (And yes, vice versa, too.)

But Hitler, and some of the very misguided souls in Charlottesville, for example, and the recent shooter who killed 11 innocent Jews in a synagogue in Pittsburgh who were in the wrong place at the wrong time were NOT simply antisemitic. They were paranoid schizophrenics, as well.

The same kind of paranoid schizophrenics who kill African Americans in their churches, people who look like Muslims on the the street, women who they think did them wrong, bosses who laid them off, kids who didn't treat them the way they think they should have been treated.

<u>Paranoid Schizophrenia</u>. You won't find that specifically in the latest DSM because the medical professions has determined that effective treatment methods for schizophrenia can be inadequate if they are too specific.

The important thing to keep in mind is that all these insane violent crimes that the press (and everyone else) says are due to "antisemitism" are actually due to severe mental illness--and done during different presidencies in different political climates in different places and for different reasons, the only thing binding them together being mental illness.

Pittsburgh was NOT garden variety prejudice, hatred, suspicion or anything like it. It was severe mental illness. The kind that makes someone take a gun or a knife or a bomb or his fists and commit murder. (Continued on Page 6)

It does not stem from hating Jews. Or gays. Or anyone else.

And while it might seem like there's more antisemitism and more hate crime violence these days, I maintain that anonymous social media opportunists, much better reporting by news outlets and watchdog groups--and a news cycle that needs to keep ringing a commercial cash register 24/7 make it seem like it's worse.

I don't think antisemitism is more pervasive today, no matter how many lists they make saying it is. In fact, people are getting smarter, less tribal and more intermixed. It's just seems worse because we are much better people and we don't take it for granted anymore. It sticks out more. We don't like it because our consciousness has been raised.

And some of it, I hate to say, maybe a great deal of it, is the result of False Flag phonies trying to make political points. And win elections. They're like the stupid kids back in my dad's neighborhood who thought they were pretty clever. But perhaps were the cunning little Satans of the time. (Read about a typical False Flag incident <u>here</u> and watch the video, too!)

Calling the horrid shooting in Pittsburgh just plain old antisemitism is a serious mistake. Because what did it is paranoid schizophrenia, a brain that has gone haywire that cannot think straight.

A person with bizarre ideas who goes out to kill people randomly is not suffering from antisemitism--or anti-anything. He's suffering from paranoid schizophrenia. And he belongs in a mental hospital and he belongs on medication to make the symptoms go away. He needs major medical intervention and major medical treatment. He needs to get his brain back to normal. Not held up as an example of antisemitism or what's wrong with "us."

Because what's wrong is with him has nothing to do with antisemitism or us. Just him, only him, isolated him.

#### **Book Review: IN PIECES** by Sally Field (Grand Central Publishing 2018)

Only Ingrid Bergman, Meryl Streep and Katharine Hepburn won more Academy Awards than Sally Field, who most of us remember as that boy-crazy surfer named *Gidget*, or the equally charming (and fatuous) Flying Nun. When Hollywood heartthrob Burt Reynolds died earlier this year, we were reminded that Sally was his fictional, and real-life, lover. But Field is more than that, and significantly greater than the sum of her parts, as we learn from her brutal, honest, and touching autobiography, In Pieces. Field is an accomplished actress, with three Emmy's; the Screen Actors' Guild; the Cannes; and a surfeit of film critics awards---having survived her childhood, her sometimes dangerous, often debilitating, men, and her dreaded TV sit-coms. She has an ingenuous literary voice, taking us along as she tries to describe and make sense of her life. She makes arresting use of the present tense for her most disturbing memories. She addresses her readers, her family and her significant others, in the same vein: "I inched myself toward something I didn't want to see, wanting them to get the picture without actually having to paint it." Field is wry and revealing about her life and her craft. Three weeks before her eighteenth birthday and six weeks after her stepfather's doctor friend drove her to Tijuana for an abortion, perfect little Sally was riding a surfboard the "size of a PT-109 on a "dreadful fake beach"

full of "dark stagnant water" and surrounded by "coarse brown sand...like the stuff they used to make concrete." The show lasted one season, but the DVD's still sell like hotcakes on Amazon. Sally later soared into into our hearts and became required watching for 4.5 million Catholic school students as Sister Bertrille, whose "wide-winged cornette" made her adorably airborne with every stiff breeze. When the reluctant Flying Nun was eight months pregnant under her habit, Sally was afforded a body-double and a reprieve from having to do all her own flying, while "wearing a cross between a one-piece bathing suit and a straightjacket, with one large screw sticking out of each hip." Field studied with the famed method acting coach Lee Strasberg and astonished audiences on big and small screens for over half a century. She seems both forgiving and contrite for the pain she suffered and visited upon others, and accepts her past as if to say: "Why not, Me, too?" Dive into her life: you'll be moved and surprised.







## CAN A BLIND WRITER INTERVIEW A BEAUTY QUEEN?

Earlier on in my life as a writer I wrote a newspaper story about two Chicago women who'd won a trip to the Academy Awards. When I interviewed the two of them they described trying on dresses for the occasion at a Chicago studio on N. Elston that names dresses after old movie stars. "I bought the Grace," one of them laughed, glancing down at her own figure. "But maybe when I wear it, it's a Liz!

The editor insisted I take that line out. Readers who recognize my byline know I'm blind, she said. How could a blind person know someone was glancing down? They'd question the story.

I had been standing right next to the woman when she said it. I'd heard her voice go down, then up. I'd felt her movement. I knew she'd glanced at herself. Sorry, the editor said. The quote had to go.

Later on I wrote a magazine profile of a female brigadier general. A photo would appear with the story, so I didn't bother describing what the general looked like. But you need visuals, the magazine editor told me. It's part of good journalism.

I could have just asked the editor what the photo looked like and written that into the story. But that didn't seem, well, like good journalism. So I picked up the phone and called the general. Her secretary answered. I told her my predicament and asked if she could tell me what her boss looked like.

The secretary thought about this a long while. Finally she said, "All of us around her, even though we know she's only five foot one, think she's seven feet."

Illinois Attorney General Republican candidate Erika Harold hails from Urbana, Illinois.

What a great quote. I used it in the article. The magazine editor kept it in. She called a few months later and said she couldn't make it to a pre-arranged interview with the new Miss America, a young woman from Illinois. Could I do the story? I said yes, and suddenly the editor sounded sorry she'd asked. "Can a blind writer interview a beauty queen?" she wondered out loud. I had to convince her I could. An excerpt from the published story:

Leading me to her hotel suite, Miss America seemed completely unfazed by my Seeing Eye dog or my blindness. "I'm used to diversity," she said. Describing her looks, she explained that her mother is part African-American and Cherokee Indian; her father Greek, German, and Russian. "I have



caramel-colored skin, long brown hair, and very expressive brown eyes," she told me. "I think it's very hard for people to tell exactly what I am."

I wonder. Would Miss America have uttered that last incisive line to a sighted reporter? I think not. The beauty queen I wrote about for that story has been interviewed a lot this year-she used her winnings as the 2003 Miss America to pay her way through Harvard Law School. Now Erika Harold is the Republican candidate running against Democrat Kwame Raoul for Illinois Attorney General. Raoul is the son of Haitian immigrants and has been in the Illinois state senate since 2004, when he was appointed to fill Barack Obama's seat. I don't know what either one looks like, but I read the papers. I listen to the radio. I know their views. and as columnist Mary Mitchell put it in the Chicago Sun-*Times*, "Although both of these candidates are black, they could not be more different and are an example of the ideological diversity that exists among African-Americans."

Diversity takes many forms. I'm looking forward to heading to the polls Tuesday.



This usually starts with a brainstorming session with our team of editors. This year, at some point in that conversation, I asked our two editors who were born and raised in other countries (New Zealand and

From our earlier days as the birthplace of Harriet Monroe's Poetry magazine, as Carl Sandburg's "city of big shoulders" and the "We real cool" milieu of Gwendolyn Brooks, to the more recent homegrown creations of the poetry slam, Louder Than A Bomb and the Poetry Foundation, Chicago is a city that builds on, and goes to battle with, verses. To celebrate this, we asked several of our city's finest poets to share a slice of our town, delivered their way.

This visual identity of this issue, as guided by designer Fletcher Martin, is guided by the pen of Tom Bachtell, a Chicagoan who many of us best knew as the longtime illustrator of The New Yorker's Talk of the Town section. Tom recently ended that engagement, and we're proud to be able to share his work with his hometown.





#### **Retired in Chicago**

Reasoning my way to a reluctant vote for Pritzker

Is not voting ever a responsible choice? I really don't want to vote in the Illinois governor's race. Voting for the antiunion Bruce Rauner was never a consideration, but I was prepared to reluctantly vote for J. B. Pritzker until hearing about the toilet scam. Seems like it would be voting for a crook.

The other two candidates, Republican state Rep. Sam McCann, who's running as a Conservative Party candidate, and Libertarian candidate Grayson "Kash" Jackson, aren't options for a liberal Democrat

The only times I've ever not voted were when I forgot to take bar association recommendations for judicial candidates into the booth. I felt no guilt about those nonvotes — we can't be expected to know about all judicial candidates, and not voting was preferable to helping elect those who were unqualified.

Lack of information about the governor's race can't be claimed. The more I learn, the lesser my liking for the only candidate for whom I could conceivably vote. Besides removing toilets to claim his mansion was uninhabitable so that he could lower his property taxes, Pritzker dodges questions. He called the property tax revelation a political hit job, and he said he wasn't involved in the renovation of the mansion when it was disclosed that workers were nonunion. He's refused to disclose details of his progressive income tax proposal and declined an invitation to appear before the *Tribune* editorial board.

It's not that I will stay out of the voting booth on November 6 but that the governor section of the ballot would be skipped. Or I'd write in someone. Illinois allows voters to write in a candidate on the blank line under the announced candidates. The vote won't be counted for the candidate unless he or she has filed an Intent to be a Write-in Candidate form, but a substantial number of write-ins would perhaps send a message.

According to the polls, Pritzker is comfortably ahead — so my no-vote shouldn't affect the outcome. Would I have considered not voting if the race were close? In all honesty, the answer is probably no. That makes me think of a Republican relative who detested Donald Trump from the start of the presidential primaries but couldn't bring himself to vote for Hillary Clinton. He voted for third-party candidate Gary Johnson. Of course, everyone thought that Clinton had the election in hand. I didn't ask him afterward whether he regretted his vote. Conceding that the polls can get it wrong, how would I feel if Rauner wins and I hadn't voted for Pritzker?

There must be some people, probably partisans, who like Pritzker, but everyone with whom I'm spoken thinks he's slimy but the only conceivable choice. People who dislike Pritzker are going to have to vote for him to keep Rauner from a second term. Am I going to claim that it's okay for other people to look the other way but I'm too principled? Puulease. My not voting for Pritzker would be expecting other people to do the dirty work so that I could keep my conscience clean.

So, I guess I've come around to reasoning that not voting for Pritzker when the only acceptable outcome is for him to win would be wrong. The opposite of what I earlier thought was the ethical course now appears to be the ethical course.

I'm kidding myself if I think it's the first time I voted for a slimy politician.

#### Loop student housing project sells for 77 million.

With real estate investors paying up for student housing, a group of Chicago developers is cashing out of a 384-bed residence hall in the Loop.

A joint venture of CA Ventures, Keith Giles and Michael Moyer sold **Arc at Old Colony**, a vintage office building they converted into student housing a few years ago, for \$76.8 million, or \$200,000 a bed, according to Cook County property records. DWS, a unit of Deutsche Bank formerly known as RREEF, bought the 124-year-old building next to the Harold Washington Library.

Big, deep-pocketed investors have been <u>piling into student hous-</u> ing over the past several years, driving up prices and attracting herds of developers that have built expensive private housing complexes with fancy amenities. The flood of capital has allowed developers like CA to sell their properties for big gains. But some observers think the market is getting <u>a little too frothy.</u>

Nearly \$10 billion in student housing has changed hands annual over the past couple years, well above the \$1 billion to \$2 billion levels before the recession, according to Real Capital Analytics. In Chicago over the summer, **the Buckingham**, a 439-bed tower near Grant Park, sold for \$74 million, and a 343-bed building in the South Loop sold for \$23 million.

## New South Loop apartment tower hits the market

The developers of Eleven40 have decided to cash out amid a strong downtown multifamily market, though a South Loop building boom could limit the enthusiasm of some buyers for the 320-unit building.

The developers of a brand-new 26-story apartment tower in the South Loop have put the building up for sale, testing investor demand for apartments in an increasingly crowded neighborhood.

CA Ventures and Keith Giles have hired CBRE to sell Eleven40, a 320-unit building at 1140 S. Wabash Ave. that opened in May. The developers have decided to cash out amid a strong downtown multifamily market—<u>rents are</u> <u>at record highs</u>—though a construction wave in the South Loop will bring more competition to the neighborhood, potentially limiting the enthusiasm of some buyers for the property.

A CBRE brochure touts Eleven40's "spectacular" in-unit finishes. such as quartz countertops and floor-to-ceiling windows, and its "first-class amenities" including a rooftop pool and fitness center with Peloton bikes. The building is close to transit—the CTA's Orange, Red and Green lines pass close by—and offers smaller apartments, averaging 607 square feet, than nearby buildings, giving it a competitive edge at attracting price-conscious college and graduate students who attend schools nearby, the brochure says. https://www.chicagobusiness.com/real-estate

Eleven40 also has filled up quickly, with 87.5 percent of its apartments leased in just four months, according to CBRE.

It's "the fastest leasing new apartment building in Chicago and has established itself with a unique product mix and competitive advantages that will long distinguish itself in an emulous market," the brochure says.

What the brochure does not mention is how competitive the South Loop market could get in the next couple years. Developers will complete more than 2,600 apartments in the neighborhood between now and the end of next year, including NEMA Chicago, an 800-unit tower at the southwest corner of Grant Park, and a 500-unit building at 1326 S. Michigan Ave., just a couple blocks from Eleven40.




